FIBROMYALGIA AND CHRONIC FATIGUE

Carolyne, an aerobics instructor, came to me with multiple medical diagnoses of fibromyalgia, chronic fatigue and polymyalgia rheumatica since the early 1990's and was constantly on pain relief, anti-inflammatory and steroidal drugs. She was miserable and didn't think anything could change for her. She is an attractive woman with lively, expressive eyes. We approached her case by balancing the spine,

posture and weight with chiropractic specific adjustments tailored to her. Within one week she had 75% fewer symptoms. Within two 90 weeks: percent improvement. One month later, she was clear of all symptoms and toured Italy for six weeks without relapse. The only pills she takes now are vitamins. Why might this have happened?

Over 6 million Americans, mostly women of child-bearing age, suffer from a collection of persistent

symptoms medically termed as fibromyalgia and chronic fatigue syndromes. In 80 percent of the cases these syndromes overlap. There are no objective tests for these illnesses so they get the name "syndrome" and the symptoms and suffering are very real. Taken all together, they are: headache, frequent infections, muscle and joint aches and tenderness in 11 of 18 designated trigger points, "brain fog", allergies, sleeplessness, stiffness, gastrointestinal problems, anxiety,

depression and loss of sex drive. There are no known causes but it is speculated that the answer may lie in neuroendocrine dysfunction - more on this later.

Typical treatments include medications for pain, insomnia, digestive problems, anxiety and depression – all treated separately. But looking at these symptoms as a whole, can we imagine a possible unifying cause? While it is difficult to quantify from one individual to another,

stress can cause any and all of these symptoms. Stress can take various forms including fear, anger, worry or resentment - at the workplace, at home or even the world around us, such as it is. There is also the biomechanical stress of a misaligned spine which alters the normal neurological signals between brain and body including hormonal balance which is precisely what neuroendocrine dysfunction means. There is a growing science psychoneuroimmunology,

which is the study of how our state of mind affects the chemicals released by the brain, affecting hormonal and immunological status. By de-stressing Carolyne's system with chiropractic adjustments, do you think her body was better able to heal itself? That's what chiropractic is all about.
